## MAYORAL MINUTE - RECOGNITION OF ACHIEVEMENTS DURING FIRST CUMBERLAND MAYORAL TERM 2017 - 2019

#### **SUMMARY**

It has been a great honour to serve as the first Mayor of Cumberland over the past two years. In this period of time we have worked hard to lay a strong foundation for a stable and successful Council.

This has involved a strong focus on making Cumberland a great place to live by continuing to deliver quality services to the community and improving the community's experience with Council. There is no doubt that significant progress has been made in unifying the services, policies, operations and setting the strategic direction of the new Council.

We have established a clear plan for the future. Council has developed new strategies and plans addressing priority areas, including children and families, youth, community safety, employment lands, disability, community facilities, environmental management, customer experience, good governance and is well on track to harmonising land use planning across Cumberland.

We have completed or are in the process of rolling out major infrastructure projects as part of an ambitious program of capital works. This includes the revitalisation of the Merrylands CBD, the Swim Centre Modernisation program and the Granville Centre amongst many others.
