A councillor who has a conflict of interest in any matter with which the council is concerned, and who is present at a meeting of the council when the matter is being considered, must disclose the interest and the nature of the interest to the meeting as soon as practicable. Both the disclosure and the nature of the interest must be recorded in the minutes of the Council meeting where the conflict of interest arises. Councillors should ensure that they are familiar with Parts 4 and 5 of the Code of Conduct in relation to their obligations to declare and manage conflicts of interests.

MAYORAL MINUTE - 10TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE DEATH OF PHIL HUGHES

SUMMARY

On November 25, 2014, Phillip (Phil) Hughes was playing the game he loved, Cricket, when he was struck by a ball in the neck. Tragically, two days later, on November 27, one of Australian Cricket's darkest days, Phil passed away due to the injuries sustained during that match.

It's been 10 years since the world was shocked by this news. Phil was playing a Sheffield Shield match in Sydney at the SCG when a bouncer was bowled. He missed his attempted hook shot, resulting in him being struck below his helmet, which ultimately led to his tragic death. This all sadly occurred just a week before Phil's 26th birthday. Phil was 63 not out when he was struck, and was on the cusp of being recalled back into the Australian Test team.

Phil hailed from the small country town of Macksville in NSW and rose to become an Australian Test, One-Day, and Twenty-20 cricketer, playing on some of the toughest pitches around the world. He was a supremely talented cricketer, as many former Australian cricketers have testified over the past decade. Phil debuted at 20 years of age, playing in 26 test matches for Australia, scoring 1535 runs. Phil also played 25 one day internationals, scoring 826 runs, and also one T20 international.

In the domestic competition, Phil also played in 114 first class matches for NSW and South Australia, scoring 9023 runs at an average of over 46 runs per innings, and a high score of 243 not out. Phil also played 91 domestic limited overs matches, scoring 3639 runs at an impressive average of over 47, and a high score of 202 not out.

Phil also played in the local big bash T20 league, representing the Sydney Thunder and Adelaide Strikers. Phil also had a number of stints abroad in England and in India. Phil also played representative cricket for Australia A and the Prime Ministers XI (11), amongst others.

As you can see by these impressive statistics, it's clear that Phil loved his cricket and that Australia loved Phil.

Phil also won a number of awards, including the New South Wales Rising Star Award 2008, Bradman Young Cricketer of the Year 2009, Sheffield Shield Player of the Year 2008/09 and Domestic Player of the Year for 2012/13.

Off the pitch, Phil was known as a loving, funny, and infectious person to be around, always aiming to make those around him smile and enjoy life. He exuded positivity and was always seen smiling and cracking a joke.



Our thoughts go out to the bowler of that ball on that fateful day, Sean Abbott. Sean has had to personally live with this incident for the past 10 years through no fault of his own, which I'm sure has been extremely challenging for him and his family.

Our thoughts are also with the Hughes family during this difficult time. Phil will forever be missed and will remain in the hearts of us all. Both inside and outside the cricket community, his spirit will always live on.

We also want to extend our heartfelt support to our colleague Clr Hughes, who is Phil's aunty. Helen, your strength is truly inspiring, and we stand with you and your family during this time of remembrance.

Therefore Councillors, tonight I move the following:
